THE UNIVERSITY

Guru Nanak Dev University was established at Amritsar on November 24, 1969 to mark the 500th birth anniversary of Sri Guru Nanak Dev Ji. The objectives of the University are to make provision for imparting education and promoting research in the humanities, learned professions, sciences especially of applied nature and technology. Studies and research on the life and teachings of Guru Nanak, promotion of Punjabi language and spreading education among educationally backward people are the other commitments.

Spread over about 500 acres towards the west of Amritsar town, the University presents a picture of modern architecture. It has 37 academic departments, two regional campuses at Jalandhar and Gurdaspur and three constituent colleges also at Jalandhar, Niari (Gurdaspur) and Mukandpur (Nawanshahr)

True to its motto ਗੁਰ ਗਿਆਨ ਦੀਪਕ ਉਜਿਆਰੀਆ (Guru's Wisdom Illumines All), the University has taken long strides in spreading the message of the Guru and promoting education in such fields as sciences, arts, management, information technology, industrial technology, environment, planning and architecture.

Recently, the University has diversified its teaching and research programmes and offers a comprehensive range of general and applied courses including self-financing courses. The curricula of all the courses have been revised and updated to meet the growing needs of the society. Admission to all the courses is made strictly on the basis of National, State and University level entrance tests. There are about 6000 students on the rolls. The University is also monitoring the teaching programmes of about 150 affiliated colleges located in Amritsar, Tarn Taran Jalandhar, Nawanshahr, Kapurthala and Gurdaspur districts. A number of skill development and job oriented courses have been initiated to make our youth more employable.

During 40 years of its existence, the University has built up an excellent academic infrastructure in the form of a well stocked computerised library, state-of-the-art laboratories, Academic Staff College, All India Services Training Centre, Instrumentation Centre, Physiotherapy Centre, Language Lab., Computer Centre, Centre for Genetic Disorders, Botanical Garden with Green House, round the clock internet facility, Placement Unit etc. The University has also been awarded the Centre for Advanced Studies in Chemistry by the University Grants Commission. The University is rated one of the top by the national and multinational companies and it offers on-campus/off campus placements. To promote research in frontier areas of knowledge, almost

all the Departments have been provided with independent computer facilities and departmental libraries.

The University is equally aware of creating necessary facilities for recreation and all round development of its students and faculty. It has Department of Youth Services, National Service Scheme, a 900 seat all purpose auditorium, half a dozen seminar rooms and conference halls, a modern hi-tech sports complex, Sports Hostel, Open Air Theatre, Faculty Club, Students' Centre, Health Centre, Day Care Centre, two separate Holiday Homes at Dalhousie for teachers and students, Working Women Hostel along with on-campus residential facilities for a large number of students, teachers and administrative staff.

Besides achieving excellence in academics, the University has also achieved a unique distinction in the field of sports. It has produced 27 Arjuna awardees and five Padam Shrees. It has won the coveted Maulana Abdul Kalam Azad Trophy for the best sporting University for a record 20 times. It has also been awarded Centre for Excellence in Sports Sciences in recognition of its unparalleled achievements in sports. The University has successfully organized 14th National Youth Festival in January, 2009.

The Campus with its lush green grounds, swaying fields, blossom-laden tree-lined lanes provides a highly conducive physical environment for work and progress. The University takes legitimate pride being the first university in the country to offer for re-accreditation and achieving the highest 'A' Grade level by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), Bangalore. The University is committed to maintain high standards of higher education and social upliftment.

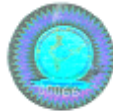

Instructions for submitting online Application Form

- 1. Candidate must submit the application form online.**
2. On-line application can be accessed from the main website of the University (www.gndu.ac.in) or through www.gnduadmissions.org
3. The first step is to deposit the application fee. For this purpose, an on-line bank transaction slip is available. This transaction slip is to be filled in by the candidate and when submitted, a print version will appear alongwith unique ID. This transaction slip is to be printed and taken to the bank for depositing the application fee.
4. The application fee is to be deposited in any branch of State Bank of Patiala. After depositing the money in the bank, the bank will issue a unique ID.
5. After a gap of minimum one working day, application form can be submitted from the same site as shown at Step No.2 above.
6. The candidates must ensure that the mandatory fields shown in red star are filled carefully.
7. After filling all the fields in the form, when the candidate clicks the submit button, a form will appear showing particulars filled by the candidate. The candidate will have an option to edit the filled particulars or lock the application.
8. Once Lock button is pressed, a print version of filled form will appear with a unique ID. The candidate must take print out of this form and paste an attested photograph on the specified space. The candidate must bring this form at the time of counselling.

7. **Normalization procedure for merit based admissions**

Normalization procedure shall be adopted for U.G. and P.G. courses in which there is no Entrance Test.

U.G. Courses

Normalization of marks will be done on the basis of marks obtained by a candidate in Senior Secondary (+2) examination conducted by C.B.S.E., I.S.C., and P.S.E.B. in the state of Punjab and U.T. of Chandigarh. There will be no normalization of marks for students from other States or Boards.

P.G. Courses

Normalization of marks will be done on the basis of marks obtained by the candidate in the qualifying examination for students graduating from Guru Nanak Dev University, Punjabi University and Punjab University. There will be no normalization of marks for students graduating from other Universities or Institutes.

Normalization for admission to U.G. courses will be carried out as follows :

$$\text{Normalized marks} = \frac{\text{Marks obtained by the candidate} \times 100}{\text{Marks obtained by the topper of the Board in the stream in which the candidate qualified}}$$

Normalization for admission to P.G. Courses will be carried out as follows :

$$\text{Normalized marks} = \frac{\text{Marks obtained by the candidate} \times 100}{\text{Marks obtained by the topper of the University in the stream in which the candidate qualified}}$$

The streams refer to combination of subjects such as Science, Arts, Commerce etc. For I.S.C. and C.B.S.E., the topper at National Level will be treated as the topper.

If a candidate has passed qualifying examination in a year before 2010, the marks obtained by the topper of 2010 will be taken for normalization.

8. Barring courses for which a state level entrance test will be conducted, application forms shall be submitted **online**. For last date for submission of applications for different courses, see **admission schedule**.
 - a) For bachelor degree courses, candidates can submit a single form for applying in more than one course in a stream (Sciences/Humanities) giving the names of the courses in the order of priority. For streams of Science and Humanities separate applications shall be submitted.
 - b) For postgraduate courses and other courses candidates applying in more than one course shall have to submit separate forms.
 - c) Each application form shall be submitted with an application fee of Rs. 1000/-. For schedule caste candidates the application fee shall be Rs. 500/-.

9. Refund of fee/security

A. (General Courses)

- i. If a candidate does not join the course and surrenders the seat after getting admission slip, the fee and funds deposited by the such a candidate will be refunded after deducting processing charges of Rs.1000/- provided the surrendered seat is filled. If the surrendered seat is not filled, only security amount will be refunded to the candidate.
- ii. A candidate, who joins the course/class, may be even for one day, and surrenders the seat in writing and seat vacated by such a candidate is filled by another candidate by the last date of admission, will be refunded tuition fee and funds with proportionate

deductions and If the surrendered/vacated seat is not filled, only security amount will be refunded to the candidate.

- iii. Shifting from one general course to another general course: Before the completion of admission process, if a candidate is allowed to shift from one general course/department to another general course/department, for this purpose, he/she will have to deposit full fee and funds for the second course opted by him/her alongwith Rs.1000/- as shifting fee. In case vacated seat is filled, the candidate will be refunded 100% fee & funds. If vacated seat is not filled, the candidate will be refunded 50% amount of fee and funds deposited by him/her against the vacated seat. These rules will be applicable for University Campus, Regional Campuses at Jalandhar and Gurdaspur and constituent colleges at Jalandhar, Mukandpur and Niari.
- iv. Refund of Security: The amount of security shall be refunded on receipt of application and No Due Certificate from the department within one year from the completion of the course.

B. Self-Financing Courses:

- i. Refund of fee: The fee and funds deposited against self-financed courses shall not be refunded in any case whether a candidate surrenders his/her seat before or after joining the course.
- ii. Shifting from one course to another course:

In case a candidate who has taken admission in a self-financed course and shifts to a general course as per merit list of the University campus, its Regional Campuses and constituent colleges, the fee and funds deposited against self-financed course shall be treated as first semester fee and funds for the general course. For second semester the candidate will deposit the tuition fee of general course and from third semester onwards, the candidate will deposit fee and funds of general course.

No shifting from self-financed course to general course shall be allowed in the second and subsequent semesters even if the seat in general course is available.

- iii. Refund of Security: The amount of security shall be refunded on receipt of application and No Dues Certificate from the department within one year from the completion of the course.

10. Each candidate shall bring a hard copy (a printed version of the **online application**) at the time of counseling (see **admission schedule**) accompanied by the following documents:
 - i. Self-attested photostat copy of matriculation or equivalent examination certificate bearing testimony to date of birth;
 - ii Self-attested photostat copy of detailed marks card of the qualifying examination, or evidence of having appeared in the qualifying examination;
 - iii Character certificate from the Principal of the college/school last attended;
 - iv Two recent passport size photographs duly attested by the Principal of the College/School last attended/gazetted officer. Photographs must be pasted on the Form with glue (Please do not use staple pins).
 - iv. Domicile certificate wherever applicable.
 - v. Reservation certificate as applicable

Note : Candidates from other than GNDU shall be required to submit migration and eligibility certificate after admission as per University rules.

11. i. Reservation of seats in a course shall be determined as per the ***Reservation Policy*** of the University.
 - ii. Applications under a reserved category must be accompanied by a certificate from the competent authority (as given in ***Reservation Policy***) stating that the candidate belongs to that particular reserved category for which he/she is claiming a seat.
 - iii. Under no circumstances, the proof of belonging to a particular reserved category shall be entertained or altered after the form has been submitted ***online***.
 - iv. All admissions made in the reserved categories will be provisional and liable to cancellation, if at any stage, any information about reserved categories furnished by the candidate is found to be fabricated or false.
12. i. Eligibility criteria for each course are available in the profile of respective *departments*. The candidates who are due to appear or have appeared in the qualifying examinations of Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar, or any other examination considered as equivalent by Guru Nanak Dev University will also be eligible, provided in such cases the result must be available by the time of *counselling* failing which they will have no claim whatsoever for admission.
 - ii. Any degree/diploma from a fake University (as notified by the UGC) shall not be considered at all as a basis/eligibility for any admission to Guru Nanak Dev University.

- iii. In case of students who have participated in the Inter-University and/or in the National Tournaments as members of University or State team, the requirement of minimum marks for purpose of admission to postgraduate courses shall be reduced by 5%.

13.

- i. Where required, entrance test shall be conducted by the university/ department as per **admission schedule**.
- ii. The details of syllabii for entrance test, mode of examination, style of questions etc. will be available from concerned Co-ordinator/Head of the Department.
- iii. In case of two candidates securing equal marks in the entrance test, the candidate younger in age shall get priority.

14. Interview/Counselling

- i. All candidates whether being admitted on merit in qualifying examination or through an entrance test shall be required to appear for interview/**counselling** before the interview panel/Board of Control/ M.Phil Committee of the department concerned on a date and time as given in **admission schedule**
- ii. If the number of qualifying candidates is more than the seats available, the Co-ordinator/Head shall have the right to call only a limited number of candidates in order of merit in the Entrance Test.
- iii. Candidates belonging to General and Reserved Categories other than Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes who secure less than 30% marks in the Department Entrance Test will not be eligible for admission even if seats are available. In the case of Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes candidates, the eligibility condition is a minimum of 20% marks in the Entrance Test.
- iv. Personal appearance of the candidate in counselling is mandatory for admission.

15.

- i. The University may not offer any course, or may increase/decrease the number of seats in a particular course.
- ii. If the number of candidates seeking admission to a course is not adequate (minimum of 5 candidates in case of PG courses and 10 in case of UG courses), the University may discontinue the course.
- iii. Candidates who have passed B.A./B.Sc./B.Com. examination under old regulations (14 years) are also eligible for admission.
- iv. Medium of instructions/ in all courses (except languages) shall be English.

16.

- i. Ragging of students is strictly prohibited on the campus. Each students must follow the directives given in **Ragging :Prohibition, Prevention and Punishment**

- ii. 75% Attendance in theory and practical separately in each paper is mandatory.
- iii. If a student does not attend the classes continuously for fifteen days without any information to the Head of the Department concerned, his/her name is liable to be struck off the rolls of the Department. He/she may seek re-admission giving valid reason for his/her absence within next fifteen days failing which he/she will forfeit the right of re-admission.
- iv. A full-time student of a course is not allowed to join a full time job. Any student found doing this at any time shall be liable to lose his/her admission or degree even at a later stage. However, this shall not apply to students who have taken leave for study from their employers.
- v. Admission to two full time courses is not allowed simultaneously .
- vi. Candidates who have already passed M.A./M.Sc. examination from this University shall not be eligible for admission to a parallel course in this University.

- i. University tuition fee for various courses along with other funds to be charged shall be notified at the time of admission. (for more details see www.gndu.ac.in.)

- i. In case of Kashmiri migrant students, the guidelines issued by the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India vide letter no. F.10-1/10-Desk(v) dated 8.3.2010 shall be followed.

- ii. In case of outstanding artists, the University shall create 15 additional seats which may be allocated to different departments on the recommendation of a committee constituted for the purpose by the Vice Chancellor.
- 19. For any discrepancy or dispute, relevant ordinances as given in GNDU Calendar shall prevail.

III. Mode of the Payment/Tuition Fee

- (i) The prescribed tuition fee would be payable at the time of admission by Bank Draft drawn from abroad in US Dollars favouring Registrar, Guru Nanak Dev University payable on any

bank at Amritsar. Other funds, fees, securities etc. as prescribed for the course under rules would be received in cash at the counter of the University in Indian currency.

- (ii) The prescribed tuition fee (non-refundable) shall be payable through a Bank Draft in U.S. dollar issued against a Bank Account of the country in which he/she is residing or in the form of a Bank Draft in equivalent Indian currency issued against the NRI account maintained in India. In the latter case, the candidate shall also produce a certificate from the Bank that the Draft has been issued against NRI account.
- (iii) A photocopy of the Income Tax clearance certificate, if available, be attached.

Note: The document must be attested by the Notary Public/Magistrate Class-I of the country in which the NRI/Foreign candidate is residing.

Foreign//NRI candidates will be admitted on the basis of merit in the qualifying examination. They shall not be required to take the Common Entrance Test.

V. Proof of Status as Foreign Candidate

The following proof shall be required for the status claimed as Foreign candidate:

- (i) Photocopy of the citizenship certificate.
- (ii) Photocopy of the passport.

VI. Proof of the Status as NRI Candidate

For this purpose, either of the following documents shall be considered as proper proof:

- (i) Copy of the Alien Registration Card (Green Card) or Non-Resident Card or Employment Card issued by the Employer.
- (ii) Photocopy of the Immigration/Employment visa entry on the passport alongwith the details of the passport.
- (iii) Certificate issued by the Indian Embassy/High Commission in the country where the NRI is residing.

Explanation for A to H

- (A) SC/ST certificate as per specimen given, to be issued by the competent authority, as per Annexure.
- (B) This includes all the specified Backward Classes whose family income does not exceed Rs. 4.5 lacs per annum or any such limit notified by the Punjab Government. Latest certificate (2008) (as per specimen given) to be issued by competent authority (as per Annexure) be attached.
- (C) For claiming "Rural Area" reservation, the candidate will have to produce certificate from Sub-Divisional Magistrate/GA to DC of having studied for minimum of two years and passed Matric/Higher Secondary Part-1 or +2 from a school situated in a rural area. This school should not fall within limits of any Municipal Committee, Notified Area or a Cantonment Board. Schools like Dashmesh Academy and those situated in a University campus, Nangal Township and Talwara Township are excluded from the list of rural category. The candidate should also be a permanent resident of rural area (village).
- (D) A candidate shall be eligible for admission under this category only if he/she is from a town/village within the belt of 10 miles from the International Border and has studied for at least five years there and has passed public examination (Matric or Higher Secondary Part-1 or +2) from a school located in a border town/village (excluding the towns of Ferozepur and Gurdaspur). Two certificates--one from the DC/ GA to DC of the District or SDO (Civil)/SDM that the town/village being within 10 miles limit from the International

Border and another from the Headmaster/Principal of the Institution with details of exact date of joining and leaving the school/college, as per the specimen, must be produced alongwith the application form.

- (E) Only the certificate showing the specific "grade" pertaining to the following three categories from Director of Sports, Punjab, Chandigarh are acceptable. The grades' shall be determined vide Pb. Govt. letter No. 47/26/83-158/2036 dt. 10.12.97.

Grade-A : Sportsmen/Sportswomen of International standing i.e. those who have represented India in recognised International Tournaments, Meets, Events, Competitions, etc.

Grade-B: First three position holders of the Senior National Championships, National Games, Junior World Championship, All India Inter-Universities competitions, National Championship under 19, National School Games under 17/All India Rural Sports.

Grade –C: First three position holders of Punjab State Championships, Inter-districts State Championships and State School Games, organized by Punjab Sports Department/ Punjab Olympic Association

- (F) The certificate should be from the Station Commander or the Commanding Officer of the Unit in the case of serving Defence Personnel and from the concerned District Sainik Welfare Officer in case of retired personnel. In case of ex-servicemen below the rank of the Officers, discharge certificate should also be produced. The Officers should produce the retirement order or service particulars.

The priority for different categories under the defence quota shall be determined as per Ministry of Defence letter No. 3547/AS(R)/94 dated 03.6.1994 endorsed by UGC vide letter No. F.1-53/98(CPP-II) dated 5.1.2005.

- (G) "Physically Handicapped" shall mean one who is blind or deaf or has lost an arm or leg or the use of any of these limbs or mentally retarded or is orthopaedically handicapped permanently as per definition given here under : Provided that a certificate about any of these handicaps shall be produced from a Professor concerned of a Medical College affiliated to Baba Farid University of Medical Sciences, Faridkot or the Civil Surgeon/Chief Medical Officer of the district.

The "Blind" are those who suffer from either of the following handicaps :

- i) Total Absence of Sight;
- ii) Visual acuity (not exceeding 6/60 or 20/200 Snellen) in the better eye with correcting lenses.
- iii) Limitation of the field of vision subtending an angle of 20 degree or worse.

The "Deaf" are those in whom the sense of hearing is non-functional for ordinary purpose of life. They do not hear, understand sounds at all events with amplified speech. The case included in this category will be of those having hearing loss more than 90 decibels in the better ear (profound impairment) or total loss of hearing in both ears.

The Orthopaedically Handicapped are those who have a physical defect of deformity which causes an interference with the normal functioning of the bones, muscles and joints. Alternatively, a child may be considered orthopaedically handicapped if his/her disability prevents him/her from participating in an acceptable manner in childhood activities of a physical, recreational or educational nature.

Mental retardation refers to sub-average general intellectual functioning which originates during the development period and is associated with impairment in adaptive behaviour.

- (H) Children of families of persons killed as a result of terrorist violence/by security forces acting in aid of civil power and for the children of innocent civilians who have sustained 100% disability in terrorist violence or during operation by security forces acting in aid of civil power/children of Sikh migrants/children of army deserters killed/100% physically disabled; Children/Grand Children of Freedom Fighters including Martyrs of Jallianwala Bagh & Kuka Lehar defined to include only sons/daughters, Grandsons/Grand-daughters (both paternal children/Grand children and maternal)/Para-military/Punjab Police/PAP Personnel killed in action and Punjab Policemen decorated with Gallantry Medals. Certificates from Deputy Commissioner/GA to DC/ADC shall be accepted.

The total reservation for all categories (excluding foreign/NRI candidates) shall not exceed 50% of the total strength in a course/class. If required, e.g. in a course where the number of seats is less than 30, the reserved categories D to H may be clubbed together or into two or more groups of categories to arrive at a whole number for making the admission. However, no one category will have more than one seat at the cost of any other reserved category if two or more seats are available by clubbing.

The reserved categories A-E and G will be open for Punjab domicile candidates only.

The candidate claiming seat under any one reserve category will be admitted on merit inter-se in that category/categories subject to fulfilling the eligibility requirements and obtaining minimum qualifying marks in the Entrance Test specified for each course separately. **All candidates must declare their claim for reserved categories at the time of filling their forms for the Entrance Test. Their subsequent claim will not be accepted.**

Admission will first be made against reserved categories and if any reserved seat remains unfilled, it will be treated as open for admission from general category candidates. The claim for a seat in any reserved category will not prejudice the right of a candidate for being considered in open merit.

ONE EXTRA SEAT MAY BE CREATED TO ADMIT A FOREIGN STUDENT SPONSORED BY THE MINISTRY OF HUMAN RESOURCES IN ANY COURSE PROVIDED NECESSARY PHYSICAL FACILITIES ARE AVAILABLE AND THE CANDIDATE FULFILS THE FOLLOWING CONDITIONS:

1. All foreign students seeking admission to this University should get either sponsorship or No Objection Certificate from Govt. of India. However, candidates sponsored by Govt. of India will be preferred.
2. All such candidates have to meet the minimum requirement of eligibility for admission to the respective course. They are also required to sit in the Entrance Test and qualify the same.
3. Foreign students residing in India and having qualified in the eligibility examination should appear in the Common Entrance Test for the said course.
4. No admission will be made after the last date of admissions approved by the Vice-Chancellor.
5. All foreign students will be admitted only after getting Eligibility Certificate issued for the course from the General Branch of the University.
6. Foreign students must have Student Visas issued by the Govt. of India.

In course where number of seats for admission is restricted due to limitation of facilities and filled quota of reservation category becomes more than 50% of total seats, an *ad hoc* marginal increase in open category quota may be allowed to fulfil the requirement of at least 50% seats in open category. This increase will not at all count towards any fresh calculation of reservation policy quota.

FOR RESERVED CATEGORIES, LATEST CERTIFICATES NEED TO BE PRODUCED.

The University also provides facility of tuition-free education to children of persons killed in November, 1984 riots and terrorist violence in Punjab State.

SCHOLARSHIPS AND AWARDS

RAGGING: Prohibition, Prevention and Punishment

The University Grants Commission vide its letter no F.1-16/2007 (CPP-II) dated June 17, 2009 has reiterated the ban on ragging of students in Institutions of Higher Learning. The students are therefore directed to strictly desist from any kind of ragging.

Forms of Ragging:

Display of noisy, disorderly conduct, teasing, excitement by rough or rude treatment or handling, including rowdy, undisciplined activities which cause or likely to cause annoyance, undue hardship, physical or psychological harm or raise apprehensive fear in a fresher, or asking the students to do any act or perform something which such a student will not do in the ordinary course and which causes him/her shame or embarrassment or danger to his/her life, etc.

Punishment for Participation in/or Abetment of Ragging:

1. Cancellation of admission.
2. Suspension from attending classes.
3. Withholding/withdrawing scholarship/fellowship and other benefits.
4. Debarring from appearing in any test/examination or other evaluation process.
5. Withholding results.
6. Debarring from representing the institution in any national or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc.
7. Suspension/expulsion from the hostel.
8. Rustication from the institution for periods varying from 1 to 4 semesters or equivalent period.
9. Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution.
10. Fine up to Rs. 25,000/-

Affidavit by students and parents

Each student and his/her parents/ guardian shall have to furnish an affidavit alongwith the application form to the effect that they will not participate in or abet the act of ragging and that, if found guilty, shall be liable for punishment under the penal law of India.

OATH COMMISSIONER

Clause -3 What constitutes Ragging : -

Ragging constitutes one or any of the follows acts:-

- a) Any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student.
- b) Indulging in rowdy or indisciplined activities by any student or students which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student;
- c) Asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student.
- d) Any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of any other student or a fresher;
- e) Exploiting the services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of students.
- f) Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a fresher or any other student by students;
- g) Any act of physical abuse including all variants of it: sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person;
- h) Any act or abuse by spoken words, emails, post, public insults which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any other student;
- i) Any act that affects the mental health and self-confidence of a fresher or any other student.

with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student.

Clause -7 Action to be taken by the Head of the institution : -

On receipt of the recommendation of the Anti Ragging Squad or on receipt of any information concerning any reported incident of ragging, the Head of Institution shall immediately determine if a case under the penal laws is made and if so, either on his own or through a member of the Anti-Ragging Committee authorized by him in this behalf, proceed to file a First Information Report (FIR), within twenty four hours of receipt of such information or recommendation, with the police and local authorities, under the appropriate penal provisions relating to one or more of the following, namely;

- i Abetment to ragging;
- ii Criminal conspiracy to rag;
- iii Unlawful assembly and rioting while ragging;
- iv Public nuisance created during ragging;
- v Violation of decency and morals through ragging;
- vi Injury to body, causing hurt or grievous hurt;

- vii Wrongful restraint;
- viii Wrongful confinement;
- ix Use of criminal force;
- x Assault as well as sexual offences or unnatural offences;
- xi Extortion;
- xii Criminal trespass;
- xiii Offences against property;
- xiv Criminal intimidation;
- xv Attempts to commit any or all of the above mentioned offences against the victim(s);
- xvi Threat to commit any or all of the above mentioned offences against the victim(s);
- xvii Physical or psychological humiliation;
- xviii All other offences following from the definition of "Ragging"

Provided that the Head of institution shall forthwith report the occurrence of the incident of ragging to the District Level Anti-Ragging Committee and the Nodal officer of the affiliating University, if the institution is an affiliated institution.

Provided further that the institution shall also continue with its own enquiry initiated under clause 9 of these Regulations and other measures without waiting for action on the part of the police/local authorities and such remedial action shall be initiated and completed immediately and in no case later than a period of seven days of the reported occurrence of the incident of ragging.

Clause -9 Administrative action in the event of ragging: -

9.1 The institution shall punish a student found guilty of ragging after following the procedure and in the manner prescribed hereinunder:-

- a) The Anti-Ragging Committee of the institution shall take an appropriate decision, in regard to punishment or otherwise, depending on the facts of each incident of ragging and nature and gravity of the incident of ragging established in the recommendations of the Anti-Ragging Squad.
- b) The Anti-Ragging Committee may, depending on the nature and gravity of the guilt established by the Anti-Ragging Squad, award, to those found guilty, one or more of the following punishments, namely;
 - i Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges.
 - ii Withholding/withdrawing scholarship/fellowship and other benefits.
 - iii Debarring from appearing in any test/examination or other evaluation process.
 - iv Withholding results.
 - v Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival etc.
 - vi Suspension/expulsion from the hostel.
 - vii Cancellation of admission
 - viii Rustication from the institution for period ranging from one to four semesters.
 - ix Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specified period.

Provided that whether the persons committing or abetting the act of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment.

- c) An appeal against the order of punishment by the Anti-Ragging Committee shall lie,
 - i In case of an order of an institution, affiliated to or constituent part, of a University, to the Vice Chancellor of the University.
 - ii In case of an order of University, to its Chancellor
 - iii In case of an institution of national importance created by an Act of Parliament, to the Chairman or Chancellor of the institution, as the case may be.

The research activities of the Department focus on synthetic organic chemistry, supramolecular chemistry, structural inorganic chemistry, drug design, material science, electrochemistry, chemistry of surfactants, chemistry of oils and fats, theoretical chemistry, thermodynamics, analytical chemistry. Every year about ten students clear UGC-CSIR (NET)/GATE test. The faculty of the Department runs more than twenty research projects funded by CSIR, UGC, DAE, DST and DBT etc. State of the art instruments like NMR, X-ray Diffractometer, GC Mass, UV, Fluorescence and Atomic Absorption Spectrometer, HPLC, DSC, Polarograph, Mossbauer spectrometer etc. are available for research and teaching. The Department has contributed more than 450 papers in SCI journals in the last decade. The contributions of the Department have been recognized both nationally and internationally and its faculty members have been awarded F.N.A.Sc. (2), CRSI gold medal, silver medal, bronze medal, Oil Technology award, Bhagya Tara Award, Prof. M. S. Wadia Award etc.

Several faculty members have exposure to foreign research laboratories in the form of post doctoral and visiting Professors/Scientists and are fellows of academies of national repute and are also recipients of research medals. The faculty has collaborations with Indian and Foreign scientists. The leading scientists visit from time to time and deliver lectures on various subjects at basic and advanced levels. The Department of Chemistry actively participates in national and international conferences and symposia. It also holds regular basis refresher courses, national conferences / symposia / meetings on regular basis.

The Department receives ONLINE journals from Royal Society of Chemistry, American Chemical Society, Taylor and Francis, Kluwer incorporation etc.. Library has collection of 16500 books/references. The Book Bank incepted from 1972, lends books to the students for the entire session at nominal charges and nearly 200 students are benefited by this. The Chemical Society, run by the students, looks after all the extracurricular activities of the students.

After completion of graduation courses, the students are generally placed in different Educational Institutes, Research establishments (such as BARC, TIFR, DRDO, PRL, IPR etc.), Defence and IT Companies.

Amardeep Singh Shergill Memorial College, Mukandpur (SBS Nagar) was taken over by Guru Nanak Dev University, Amritsar on July 4th, 2007 as a Constituent College with the mission to provide quality education to the rural deprived youth. The University is in process to establish this institution as its Rural Regional Campus. In the first phase the professional courses like M.C.A (Three Year) and M.B.A (F.Y.I.C) were started from the academic session (2008- 2009). MBA (two years) is being started from current session.

The College was established in 1994 in memory of Amardeep Singh Shergill, an illustrious student of London School of Economics who passed away in prime of his youth. He was the only son of S. Gurcharan Singh Shergill, an NRI from England. Instead of getting subdued in grief, the father decided to serve noble cause of spreading the light of knowledge amongst rural youth.

The College is situated in Mukandpur, a small town in District SBS Nagar. It is about 10 Kms from Banga, 22 Kms from Phagwara and 22 Kms from Phillaur. The campus sprawls over 20 acres with an architecture that merges with the landscape. It has a magnificent triple storey building with all facilities essential for imparting quality education. It houses a double storey library, which has more than 23500 books on its open shelves. More than 40 Journals & magazines and 13 newspaper are also available. The library has an E-Book section also. The library is also member of N-LIST established by INFLIBNET, AHMEDABAD. Under this membership, we are getting access to 2100 E-Journals and 51000 E-Books. The students can view the educational C.D's in the library. College library is providing facilities of internet and photocopy both to students and faculty members. Latest equipments like O.H.P., multi-media; T.V., Stereo, and DVD etc. are employed as teaching aids. The College has Chemistry, Botany, Home Science, Child Care, Dairy Farming. Music, Physics, Dress Designing and Automobile Maintenance labs. There is a separate Computer Science and I.T Centre, which has five state of the art Computer Labs with 127 computers & Internet connectivity of 1mbps (1:1) through radio link. Keeping in view the deteriorating standard of the English Language amongst rural youth an English language lab with Re-Net software imported from Finland has also been set up inside the College campus. There is a separate Seminar Hall with a seating capacity of 170 persons. Hostel facility for 80 girls is also available.

Gymnasium with its latest imported machines is a cynosure of all the eyes. Darshan Gill Sports Complex with a track of four hundred meter has playfields for Football, Hockey. Volleyball and Handball. A fleet of buses carries the girl students to College and back. The beautiful open-air theatre helps our students to nurture their academic and cultural capabilities. To widen the horizons of the learners, seminars and extension lectures by eminent speakers are arranged in the College from time to time. Separate units of N.C.C and N.S.S are working to make our students disciplined and service oriented citizens. Educational trips are arranged during the session to cultivate team spirit, mutual adjustment and tolerance among the youth apart from being a medium for entertainment. Various cultural programmes including talent hunt, University youth festival and Amardeep Mela are also organized.

The University Library has a collection of about 4,27,000 documents. Named after the great Sikh Scholar, Bhai Gurdas, the University Library is housed in a five-storey magnificent building visible from the main gate of the University. It supports the academic, research and teaching needs of the students and the Faculty.

The Library remains open on all days of the year except for 26th January and 15th August. Admission to the library is reserved for bonafide members only. There is a separate air-conditioned reading hall which remains open 24 hours and 365 days for the students. The readers have free access to books and periodicals. Manuscripts and rare books can be consulted only through special requisition. The library has been organized into different sections such as Acquisition, Technical, Reference, Periodical, Circulation, Documentation, Text Books, Rare books and Manuscripts, Xeroxing & Microfilming, Computer, Digital, Binding and Filing. There is a separate Reading Hall in the Periodical Section.

The University Library subscribes to 418 current Indian & Foreign Journals, 30 popular journals and 22 newspapers. More than 150 journals/periodicals are received as gift. The Library also provides INTERNET service and is a member of INFLIBNET UGC Infonet-e-journals Consortium programme which is providing free access to over 6000+e-journals and some databases. Library is also getting access to 233 online journals from INDEST. Library has got the membership of Delnet. Faculty members, research scholars and students can get any book/article on inter library loan from Delnet. The backsets of research journals are available in bound form. The Library possesses about 5170 rare books and 1516 manuscripts which date back to 15th and 16th centuries. All these manuscripts have been digitized and are available in CD/DVD form. A Separate section of Prof. Pritam Singh's Collection consisting of 10500 rare books and 1000 manuscripts has been organized. The Reference Information of manuscripts is available on NET and also in printed form. OPAC is available for the help of students. Apart from these, Bhai Gurdas Library has its own website <http://library.gndu.ac.in>. Internet services are also provided to bonafide users of the library at nominal charges. Private Photocopy service @39 paisa per page is available in the Library. This facility is available on all days. To serve the immediate needs of the students and the faculty, the Library has also established 19 Departmental Libraries in various buildings.

University Boys' Hostels provide accommodation to about one thousand students. Messes in the hostels are run on co-operative basis. These are managed by Mess Committees of the students under the supervision of the hostel Wardens. The mess halls are furnished with furniture, curtains, desert coolers, inverters, deep freezers, water filters, fire extinguishers etc. In addition to the hostel mess, canteen service is also available from 6.00 a.m. to 11.00 p.m. Snacks, tea, coffee, juice, milk products and other services are provided.

About 30 leading newspapers, magazines and periodicals in Panjabi, Hindi and English are subscribed. There is also a guest room in each hostel for the guests of the students. Hostels also have PCOs and stationery shops. Computer Lab. with Internet facility has been provided for the hostlers that remains open from 3 P.M. to 11.00 P.M.

The University has three girls' hostels providing accommodation to nearly twelve hundred students. ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION TO HOSTELS

The placement brochures for these courses are published every year by The Placement Unit and sent to potential employers to attract their attention for recruitment drives.

Since its inception in 1998, the Unit has been able to place students in various reputed multinational companies at very handsome salaries. High profile companies like TCS, Wipro, Satyam, Accenture, L&T, Cognizant, CMC, DCM, Vardhman, Panacea Biotec, Ranbaxy, ICICI Bank, HDFC Bank, Centurian Bank of Punjab etc. visit the campus regularly for recruitment. The highest salary offered last year was Rs. 6.00 lac per annum and average package was Rs. 2.70 lac.

The University Health Centre provides free medical help to all students, teachers, staff and their dependents and retired persons. The Centre also provides alternative medicine in its Ayurvedic Dispensary. The facilities available in the Centre include clinical lab., ECG, ultrasound, surgical procedures and ambulance service. The Health Centre is adequately assisted by paramedical and nursing staff. Health Centre also participates in the academic programmes of Department of Sports Medicine & Physiotherapy, Physical Education, Microbiology and Pharmaceutical Sciences. The Health Centre has also a full-fledged Physiotherapy Centre with an orthopaedic surgeon as its Head. The Centre is providing specialized physiotherapy services to the sportspersons. The Health Centre remains open for 24 hours even on Sundays and Holidays. The Health Centre has also set up a medical room in girls' hostels and a staff nurse is available from 8.00 p.m. to 8.00 a.m. daily.
